EVENT DAY AND FOLLOW-UP

- Have a community medical service onsite for the day such as St. John's Ambulance, should anyone require medical attention.
- Have volunteers control access points so that only those individuals who are part of the event are allowed on the property.
- Ensure the Field Marshals and dog handlers use their information package to orient their groups to potential safety issues at the hunting station such as location of public roadways and that they reinforce the safety rules list throughout the day.
- Ensure all Apprentices and Mentors wear hunter orange including both a hat and vest or coat.
- Have all Apprentices and Mentors check in at a registration desk when they arrive so they know where to go to meet the Field Marshal and location of the portable gun rack to temporarily store their firearm.
- Have the trap shooting station volunteers remind the Apprentices and Mentors about safe gun handling.
- Have a supply of disposable ear plugs at the trap shooting station for ear protection.
- Ensure all drivers and passengers on ATV's and other off road vehicles are wearing approved helmets.
- Ensure the Field Marshals and dog handlers work together to identify and communicate safety issues to the Mentors and Apprentices when at the hunting station.
- Commit the planning committee to a process of annual review to identify the things that went well and areas for improvement with respect to safety so your event improves year after year.
